Great to see some new faces out and about.


The March rally was focused on training for rhythm and relaxation. 3 new prospective members came, played with us, and gave some great feedback!

NZEAN PRESENTS TO PARLIAMENT - April 3rd

<u>Shelly Warwick</u> (chair) and <u>Tina Budd</u> (secretary) presented to the select committee at Parliament, following on from NZEAN's Vulnerable Road User Petition submission last year.

The Select Committee was very receptive to the NZEAN plea for change and recognition and asked some very NZEAN favourable questions to NZTA & Ministry of Transport—which they were unable to answer.

annoyed at NZTA and MOT actually shake the political tree and some action is taken "

This 2050 Walking and Riding Strategy (vision) is a pleasure to read because it recognises recreational horse riders equally to walkers and cyclists. "An important part of this is to make walking and riding an accessible, safe, enjoyable and healthy activity that becomes a part of daily life whether for transport or recreation, or both.

The provision of trails also contributes to a healthy community and can increase safety by reducing the number of walkers, cyclists and horse riders sharing roads with other road traffic."

This is NOT the standard across NZ and it should be.

OUR PRINCIPLES



Four key principles form the basis of this Walking and Riding Strategy. These principles will guide and inform the decisions that will shape our walking, cycling and horse riding future.

Collaboration - The Council recognises that it cannot implement this strategy on its own. We endeavour to continually work to build and strengthen relationships with all stakeholders, including mana whenua, New Zealand Transport Agency Waka Kotahi, Hurunui Trails Trust, St James Trail Trust, Hanmer Springs Trails Network Group, Community Boards and committees, neighbouring councils and any other stakeholders.

Inclusive – we consider the needs of all users to ensure walking, cycling and riding infrastructure is accessible to, and usable by, as many people as possible.

Efficiency – make best use of existing infrastructure and prioritise actions that will have the greatest benefits

Strategic alignment - the Strategy aligns with relevant national, regional and local strategies and plans.

The four principles are not mutually exclusive, and nor are the principles set out in a hierarchy. All the principles have been weighed up in an overall consideration of the relative influence any given issue or opportunity may have in the implementation of this Strategy.

What is the definition of Active Transport?

Active transport is physical activity undertaken as a means of transport and not purely as a form of recreation. This can include walking, cycling, horse riding, skating and skateboarding. It is a great way to keep healthy and fit, save money and reduce your impact on the environment. Active transport is an easy way to be regularly active and can help you fit 30 minutes of physical activity into your daily routine.

Last September`s **Pass Wide and Slow Rides** were very popular and successful and well received by the public

-so this is becoming an annual event !!!

It has also given birth to a new entity.

The international Pass Wide & Slow road safety message has been brought to Aotearoa and is supported by the community as there is an immediate need to educate drivers on how to approach and pass a horse on the road safely

Pass Wide & Slow New Zealand has been established with the aim of reducing the number of incidents, deaths and near misses on our roads.

This will sit as a permanent education and road safety platform
